The walk in Bretton Country Park has outstanding views with its lake and bridges but is quite steep in places and includes the magnificent Yorkshire Sculpture Park, which is great for the family and is an international centre for modern and contemporary art and enjoyed by thousands of visitors every year.

Explore open-air displays by some of the world's finest artists, Henry Moore, Anthony Caro, Antony Gormley, Barbara Hepworth, James Turrell, Andy Goldsworthy and many artists. Enjoy fascinating exhibitions throughout four stunning galleries, be inspired by the natural beauty of an historic estate, and get involved in a dynamic line up of events and activities.


From Summer 2011, visitors can discover some of YSP's hidden secrets as historic lakes and woodland are opened to the public for the very first time in the Park's long history, including reinstated long-forgotten footpaths and bridges, and restored delightful features including a Greek-style Summer House, a now landlocked Boathouse, Stepping Stones and a magical Shell Grotto, all in this much-loved landscape.

 Sculpture Park Centre close by there is a restaurant and café and also a Café at the YSP Learning Centre – see site map.






- Toilets There are toilets at the Bretton Country Park entrance, and YSP Centre and Learning Centre.
- Path The paths in Bretton Country Park are very steep and indicated on the YSP map path is a wheelchair symbol [ this is only suitable for motorised wheelchairs pushchairs will find this hard work with a pusher, and it may be too hard for manual wheelchairs you will need to have a look and assess this individually.] Also in the winter months this path can be quite muddy choose your day.

Wheelchair users can contact YSP who will advise you on the various areas as the Country Park has a number of steep paths.

From the car park take the left hand path downwards which is made up of rubber mesh [ see photo ] towards the Gate & Dam Head Bridge and then follow this path at the side of the lakeside and view the splendid scenery and discover the various sculpture statues.

When you arrive near the Bretton Hall you can either take the steep grass track [marked in **red** on the walk map] upto the YSP Centre – Or continue on the path or smooth grass path at the side of the lake past sculptures [D – Promenade] and [E – One and Other] to the Cascade Bridge before making your way up to the YSP Learning Centre and continue to the main YSP Visitors Centre – see the walk map.




